Warwick School boys gathered in glorious sunshine last summer for a whole school photo. Over 1,100 boys from the Junior School through to the sixth form were joined by staff and the Head Master to be captured on camera.





National swimming success

The school's U14 team qualified for the ESSA Swimming Championships in November. This is the second consecutive year Warwick School has qualified and only the third time ever. At the Championships the boys gave outstanding performances, taking a further two seconds off their previous best times and managing to secure medals in the last strokes of their races. This is considered to be the strongest Warwick School U14 team ever. They broke school records by taking nine seconds off the Medley (mixed stroke) Relay record and six seconds off the Freestyle Relay record. An outstanding performance and the first medals for the school at the National Championships.



OW Engineering Award

Tom Allitt, one of the recipients of the 2010-11 OW Engineering Award, is pictured with his unique carbon fibre handlebars. The handlebars were engineered for Tom's 'A' level project. The one-off award was made possible thanks to the generosity of an Old Warwickian who wanted to encourage a passion for engineering.

Tennis champs

The school's U14 tennis team made school history at Nottingham Tennis Centre, by being the first Warwick School team to qualify for the National Finals.

The 2011 competition started with 2,700 competitors. Warwick School won through to the last four, competing in the UK finals in December and finishing third.

Remembrance Sunday

Warwick School marked Remembrance Sunday, both in school and in the town. In the morning, the CCF marched through Warwick and laid a wreath at the war memorial. During the Chapel Service, Owen James (WS 1993-03) spoke about his recent experiences as a soldier in Afghanistan.



Sri Lanka Cricket Tour

Thirteen boys from last year's M5 to U6 travelled to Sri Lanka to compete in the Inaugural Murali Cup. The tournament was organised in conjunction with charity The Foundation of Goodness, to continue support for rural communities after the 2004 tsunami. The boys played five matches against two other English schools, two Sri Lankan schools and the Kuala Lumpur Cricket Academy. They were also able to work with the charity to clean and paint a classroom at the Foundation's school.

OWA AGM

The OWA AGM took place on 3 December 2011. Reports were received from the Chairman, Treasurer, Alumni Officer and OW Properties and Old Warwickian Trust.

At the OWA AGM 2010 a resolution was approved to set up a Trust or Charity for the purpose of making grants to Warwick School for bursaries or capital projects. Subsequently, a private limited company, Old Warwickian Trust, was incorporated under the companies act in January 2011. In June 2011 Old Warwickian Trust was entered in the Register of Charities. In September 2011 an EGM of Old Warwickian Properties Ltd approved the transfer of its assets to Old Warwickian Trust and authorised the Directors to wind up the company. As a result, the property assets, namely 3 Church Street and the Sports Ground, were transferred to the Trust at the end of September. Final accounts of OWP and the winding up process are well advanced and, at the conclusion, will result in a final cash gift to the Trust.

The inaugural Trustees of Old Warwickian Trust – R Thornton, G Thorpe, C Mason, J Meredith, N Robinson, the Head Master, Chairman OWA (R Dixon) and Governor (D Stevens) held their first meeting in October 2011. The Trustees will give an annual report to the OWA at the AGM.

Spotlight on... Joe Elliott

Joe loved his time at Warwick and is very proud to be an Old Warwickian. He admits that scholastically, he achieved very little at school. However, the respect and discipline ne witnessed and experienced at school has helped him hroughout his life. They have helped shape his character and

ichievements and have also instilled in him a great desire to work for the community

Upon leaving school Joe went into the family garage and cycle business, Elliotts of Coventry. With Joe's direction it became a car accessory business and became a household name in the city and surrounds. He sold the business in 2004 and has since spent much of his time working for the community. In the 1980s he started the group A1 Motor Stores and was its founder Chairman.

Today, Joe is a Board Member and Chairman of Coventry Transport Museum and a Director of Jaguar Heritage. He works with a number of local and national charities including the RNIB, Myton Hospice and the NSPCC's Boole House in Coventry.

He was honoured to recently receive the Citizen of Coventry and the Ambassador of Coventry Awards.
